Present and Future of Migraine Research

onquering migraine: building on the present, exploring the future was the title of the exciting 8th annual migraine meeting, which was held in Rome last May, under the auspices of Laboratorios Almirall. The meeting chaired by Prof. F. Antonaci (Pavia, Italy) covered interesting topics including a discussion of the artistic and historical perspective of migraine, the value of neuroimaging findings and the potential influence of genetics. Some key practical considerations were also reviewed, such as the influence exerted by both physicians and patients on the choice of treatment and clinical outcome, as well as the importance of diagnosing and treating comorbid conditions that may affect the prognosis of migraine.

The first topic presented by Prof.. Vincenzo Guidetti (Rome, Italy) focussed on historical and artistic expressions of headache, particularly migraine, across the centuries in paintings and writings from the earliest recorded "evidence" to con-

temporary descriptions and illustrations. This presentation was followed by that of Dr. Margarita Sánchez del Río (Madrid, Spain) who reviewed how recent advantages in functional neuroimaging techniques enable the assessment of functional activity of specific brain areas, which are relevant for the pathophysiology of migraine. Then, Dr. Pasquale Montagna (Bologna, Italy) presented relevant research studies on the identifica-
