Back from the European Headache School in Mikonos

he 3rd Mediterranean Headache Summer School, organized by the Hellenic Headache Society in conjunction with the European Headache Federation, was successfully held in the island of Mykonos Greece on 12-16thSeptember 2007.

The School, which was designed so as to cover a comprehensive spectrum of the issues connected with Headache, extended over a period of three days and was divided into two daily Sections, one comprising the significant announcements relating

to the developments in the main areas of the field with emphasis on Migraine, TTH and TAC's, and the other consisting of work shops discussing and enlightening the presentations.

PET studies in cluster headache (CH) showed increased blood flow in the ipsilateral hypothalamus and voxel MRI morphometry structural differences in the gray matter, findings implicating the hypothalamus in CH

causation. Proton MR spectroscopy (1H-MRS) non invasively measures N-acetylaspartate (NAA), a neuronal marker reduced when neuronal dysfunction occurs. Authors performed MRS in 26 patients with CH and 12 controls. Eighteen patients had episodic (8 outside and 10 within the cluster), while 8 chronic CH. 1H-MRS was performed in a 1.5-T GE scanner. VOI included the hypothalamic gray matter. Spectra were acquired using PRESS single voxel sequence. Additional spectra were acquired from midline parietal-occipital cortex and left parietal white matter. Peak areas for NAA. creatinephosphocreatine (Cr), and choline (Cho) were calculated using time domain fitting program AMARES/MRUI. In CH patients, hypothalamic NAA/Cr was significantly reduced compared to controls. Hypothalamic NAA/Cho was significantly also Hypothalamic duced.

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NAA/Cr was lower in all 3 CH patient subgroups (episodic CH in cluster, outside cluster, and chronic CH) compared to controls. The reduction of NAA is consistent with hypothalamic neuronal dysfunction in CH. Such an alteration seems to represent a permanent feature of patients with CH. The prize will be delivered to the authors during the award section

at the forththcoming Italian Society for the Study of Headache (SISC) meeting in Pavia (29th September 2007). The author/s is requested to have a presentation of the major achievement of the paper in the field of cluster headache. Almirall Italy has kindly sponsored the Award.
