However, the subject needs to be deeply discussed because there is no doubt that headaches coming from the neck do exists. This is the reason why the clinicians and scientists of the Cervicogenic Headache International Study Group (CHISG) use to meet every year to discuss the subject in deep and share there own experiences on the field as well as there clinical and research data. The CHISG under the Presidency of Torbjorn Fredriksen, Professor of Neurosurgery at the

Trondheim University Hospital, in Norway includes neurologists, neurosurgeons, ortopaedic surgeons, rheumatologists, physical therapy doctors, psychologists and general medicine doctors. This year the CHISG will meet in Porto, Portugal from 23 to 26th of June.
